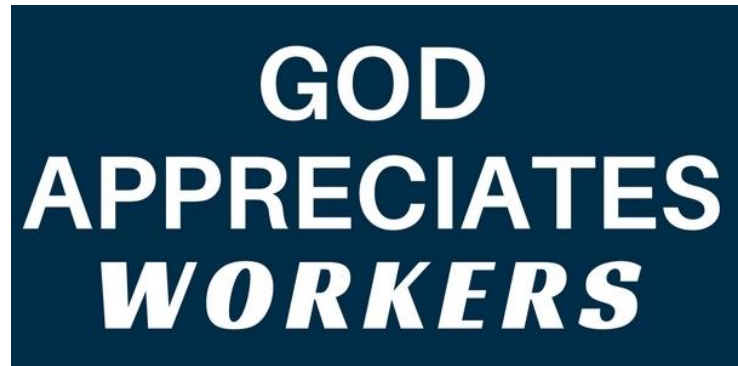

GOD APPRECIATES WORKERS

Just before Labor Day, *The Wall Street Journal* published an article by Nicholas Eberstadt titled "The Idle Army: America's Unworking Men." Less than 85% of American men between the ages of 25 and 54 are working, a percentage even lower than the percentage in the years following the Great Depression. Nearly 10 million men in this category are not working, and apparently are not seeking work. Eberstadt writes,

In short, the American male's postwar *flight from work* is a grave social ill. Strangely, nearly everyone—the news media, major political parties, intellectuals, business leaders, policy makers—has managed to overlook it. The urgency of the moment is to bring this invisible crisis out of the shadows (emp. added).

A sizable minority of American men are fleeing from work. These men, who refuse to work, are described in the Bible in 2 Thessalonians 3:10-12:



For even when we were with you, we would give you this command: If anyone is not willing to work, let him not eat. For we hear that some among you walk in idleness, not busy at work, but busybodies. Now such persons we command and encourage in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living.

If our society would follow Paul's principle in this passage, there would no longer be a substantial portion of the population that sat on the sidelines while the rest labored.

Eberstadt goes on to explain how over 100 million Americans are working harder than ever, but at the same time the number of those refusing to work is on the rise. The obvious result is that those who refuse to work are being supported by those who do work. But notice that the Bible teaches not that society should provide for those who refuse work, but the opposite. Again, from the apostle Paul to the Thessalonians:

But we urge you ... to aspire to live quietly, and to mind your own affairs, and to work with your hands, as we instructed you, so that you may walk properly before outsiders and be dependent on no one (1 Thessalonians 4:10-12).

God has dignified work. It is natural for people to get satisfaction from the various jobs they do. Work provides not only personal satisfaction, but also the means for society to function. We are grateful to God for the ability and opportunity to work, to His glory (Colossians 3:23)

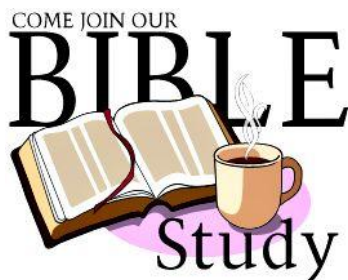
ELLIJAY YOUTH RALLY

GATLINBURG/PIGEON FORGE RETREAT FEBRUARY, 2017

Friday, Saturday, and Sunday nights February 17, 18, 19, 2017 (leaving on Monday, Feb. 20) the Walden Lodge and Cabins have once again been reserved for the retreat to Gatlinburg/Pigeon Forge Tennessee. The cost per room is \$180. The food must be paid for all who are 10 years old and older. For those under 10 there is no charge. The cost is \$35.00 per person. You may still pay in 2 installments if you wish. The first money will be due from September 25 – October 9, 2016. The second payment will be due on Sunday, Dec. 11, 2016. Food cost will be due January 15, 2017.

We would like to try something new this year. Would you like to plan an evening meal? Perhaps you and a small committee could plan, purchase the food (you will be reimbursed or given money ahead), fix ahead as much as you can and transport to Gatlinburg. Some items you may prefer to purchase in Pigeon Forge. Breakfast and lunch will remain the same.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS JOY

We will participate in Operation Christmas Joy again this year and we invite everyone to participate. It is a Panama Mission project that impacts thousands of needy children every December. We will provide plastic gallon-size bags filled with small toys, personal care items, school supplies and candy for needy children in Panama. This is our fifth year to participate. We started out with 25 boxes, then 35 boxes. We sent over 50 bags when we participated in 2014. Each gift is accompanied by a teaching tract which has a list of local congregations.

We'll concentrate on boys and girls aged 5 to 6 years this year. Please see the flyer for a suggested shopping list. If you are unable to shop, you can donate money in order to cover the cost of shipping, taxes, and distributing the gifts. We are again sending blankets for moms who are staying in the hospital with their sick child. The hospitals are kept very cool and they do not have warm clothes.

We will bag the gifts on Sunday, September 25.
